
February 20-23 at 8pm, Culbreth Theatre

The concert will feature organist Bruce Stevens and consist of works by Buxtehude, Bach, Mozart, Brahms and Rheinberger. Stevens frequently plays for the annual national conventions of the Organ Historical Society, and he has performed for regional conventions of the American Guild of Organists and most recently, for the national convention of the American Institute of Organbuilders. Active as a recording artist, he has recorded seven discs for Raven Recordings.
